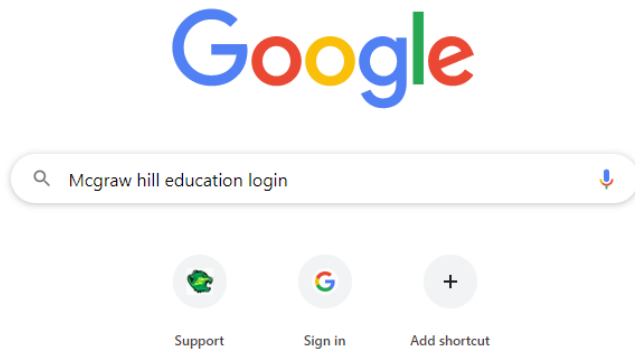


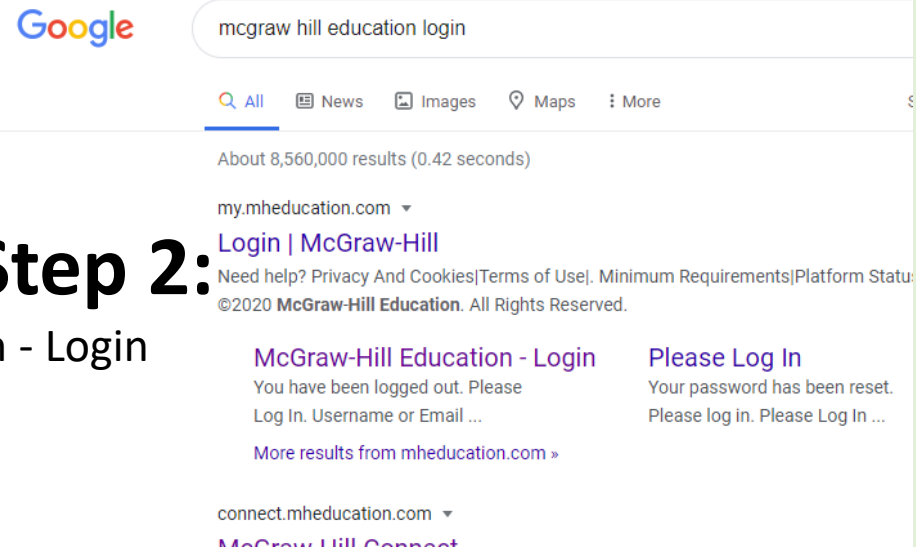
How to Access and Use your US History Since 1877 textbook:

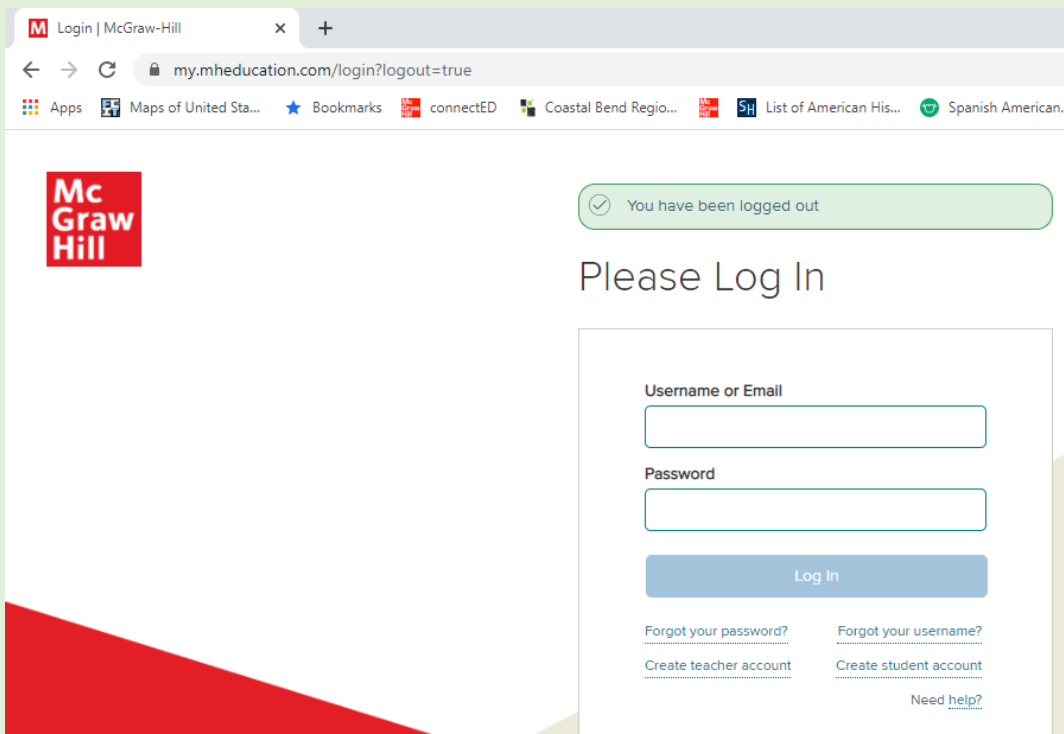

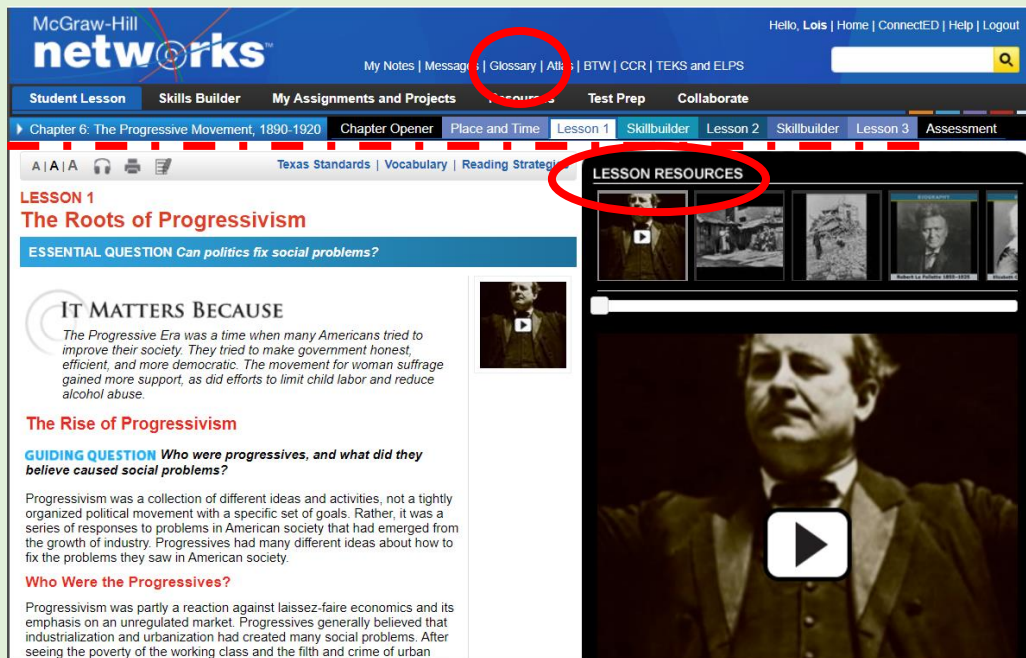
To Use the textbook:

3. Click Go



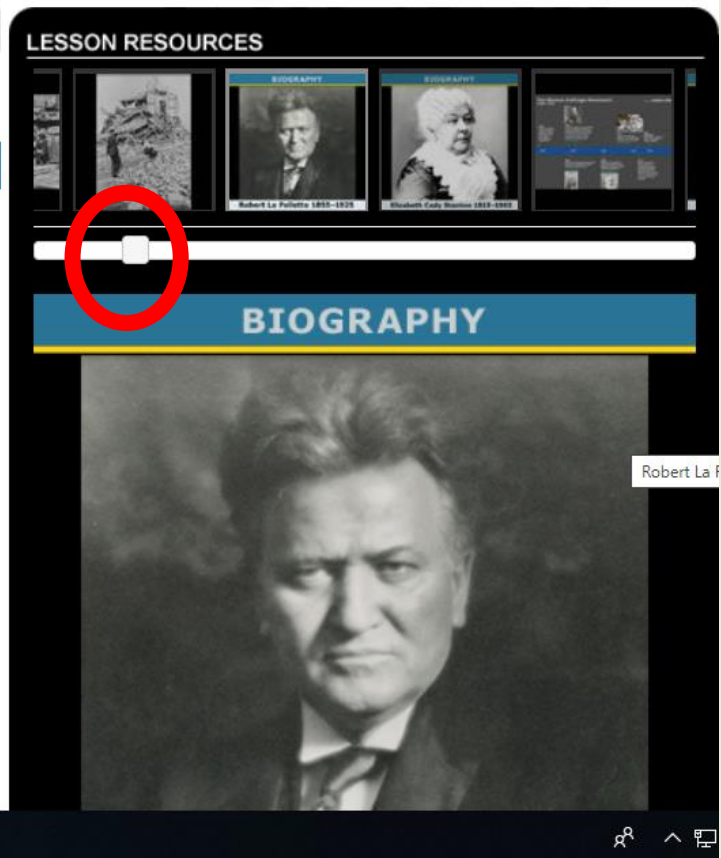
Example:

- Based on assignment directions: choose the Chapter and Lesson.

Review contents of Lesson Resources:

- Find the Term: Glossary on the top Menu line

Read the Biography information; use scroll bar if necessary for all information


Answer the questions

Robert La Follette (1855–1925)

Future congressman, senator, governor, and Progressive Party leader Robert La Follette was born in Primrose, Wisconsin, in 1855. He grew up to study law at the University of Wisconsin. From 1880 to 1884, La Follette served as the district attorney of his home county before making a successful bid for Congress. He served three terms in Congress but was unsuccessful in his run for a fourth. Politics, however, remained a concern, and he began to advocate progressive ideals.

Regardless of his progressive leanings, La Follette assumed the role of governor of Wisconsin as a Republican in 1901. A run for the U.S. Senate followed, and La Follette was elected in early 1905. As senator he remained a great champion of laborers and called for improved working conditions. In 1912, the man his admirers nicknamed "Fighting Bob" attempted to snare the Republican nomination for the presidency. His failure to do so did not stop him from trying again in 1916, and then attempting to become the Progressive Party nominee in 1924. That final time, he was successful. La Follette died
